As the Thanksgiving holiday approaches, we include three hymns of

Thanksgiving in our worship service today. The Organ Pre-Service featured settings of "Now Thank We All Our God" (Hymn No. 555), originally written near the end of Germany's Thirty Years' War by Martin Rinkart.

Our Hymn of Praise, "We Gather Together" is set to a folk tune from the Netherlands and was written during Holland's struggles for independence from Spain in the 17th C. Our Sending Hymn, "Come, Ye Thankful People, Come" is considered "one of the finest harvest hymns in all hymnody." Its tune name memorializes St.

George's Chapel, Windsor, where composer Sir George Job Elvey spent most of his musical career.

All three of these hymns remind us of God's providence and the importance of giving gratitude to God for the earth's bounty as well as for our safety and well-being.
