Brothers James Weldon and John Rosamond Johnson collaborated in the composition of this powerful hymn, originally for a celebration of Abraham Lincoln’s birthday. It gained wide popularity and soon became known as the “Negro National Anthem,” and is now considered the official song of the NAACP, which James Weldon served as national secretary. On the eve of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, we “lift every voice” and sing as one nation.
