

ENGAGING WITH THE WEEKLY PSALM

The Psalms of Ascent were sung by the Israelites as they walked uphill to Jerusalem for Passover and other Jewish festivals. We invite you, as part of your journey to Good Friday, to allow this week's Psalm to sink more deeply into your heart by continuing to engage with it.
