## **Maundy Thursday**



Sundown on Maundy Thursday to sundown on Easter Sunday is considered the most solemn part of the liturgical year. This three-day period is referred to as the *Easter Triduum* which recounts the last three days of Jesus' life on earth. Though chronologically three days, they are seen and experienced as a unity, unfolding for us the events and mystery of Christ's Passion and Resurrection.

Maundy Thursday recalls the evening Christ spent with his disciples in the upper room, where he washed their feet, declaring himself servant and chief “cleanser” of all; shared his Last Supper with his disciples; and gave them a new commandment to love one another just as he had loved them.

This is the story we join with tonight as we worship the One come to be our Savior.

## ~ Good Friday Service of Darkness (Tenebrae) – 7:00pm ~

Good Friday marks the death of Jesus Christ – called “good” because of what Jesus’ death ultimately means for the redemption of the world.

The service takes its name – Tenebrae, from the Latin word for ‘darkness.’ Each portion of the Passion narrative is marked by the extinguishing of a candle, and lights are gradually dimmed – to complete darkness. In this way, we recall the sorrow of Christ’s light passing from the world, even as we anticipate its return on Resurrection Sunday.
