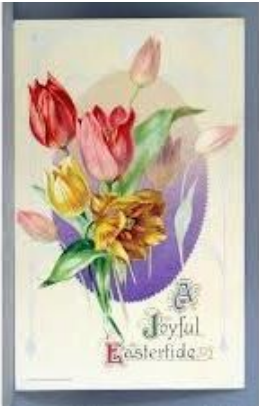

Eastertide

Eastertide is the period of 50 days, spanning the time from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday.

Each Sunday of the season is treated as a Sunday of Easter, with Easter Sunday being the first Sunday of Eastertide and the following Sunday as the second Sunday of Eastertide and so on, concluding with Pentecost Sunday. (hence, 50 days)

Scripture readings during Eastertide often come from Acts of the Apostles —emphasizing that the church, as empowered by the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, is the best witness to the resurrection and the work of God in the world through Jesus Christ.

The colors of this liturgical season feature white and gold.
