Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my thoughts.

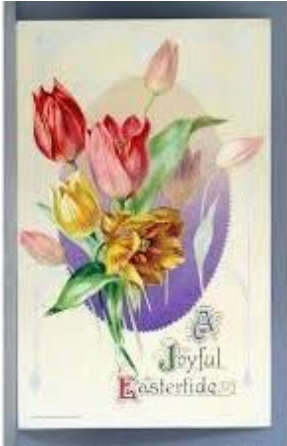

Each Sunday of the season is treated as a Sunday of Easter, with Easter Sunday being the first and the following Sunday as the second Sunday of Eastertide, Third Sunday, and so on, concluding with Pentecost — next Sunday, May 23.

Typically, the colors of Eastertide feature white and gold.
