In 1941, while working in the village of Abbots Leigh, England, at the wartime headquarters of the BBC, the Rev. Clyde Taylor composed the tune which he called ABBOT'S LEIGH. Enjoy listening to and learning this stirring melody.

Translated "Glory be to the Father," the Gloria Patri was sung by early Christians as an acclamation of the three Persons of the Trinity. "As it was in the beginning" was added in the 4th century to counter the heresy that the Son, Jesus Christ, was created by God instead of being one with God from the beginning. This beautiful tune was written by our organist, John Rafoth.

This offertory anthem is based on Psalm 51, David's prayer of confession after Nathan the prophet confronted David with his sinful relationship with Bathsheba in 2 Samuel 12. Notice that David's sin could only be handled by God—David was helpless to help himself—just like us.

The First Nations Version is a dynamic equivalence translation of the New Testament that captures the simplicity, clarity, and beauty of Native storytellers in English, while remaining faithful to the original language of the Bible. Whether you are Native or not, you will experience the Scriptures in a fresh and new way.

Our Father, who is in heaven, holy is your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors.
